



WEEK ONE

Acts 4:8-12 (NLT) Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them, “Rulers and elders of our people, are we being questioned today because we’ve done a good deed for a crippled man? Do you want to know how he was healed? Let me clearly state to all of you and to all the people of Israel that he was healed by the powerful name of Jesus Christ the Nazarene, the Man you crucified but whom God raised from the dead. For Jesus is the one referred to in the Scriptures, where it says, ‘The stone that you builders rejected has now become the cornerstone.’ There is salvation in no one else! God has given no other name under heaven by which we must be saved.”

Acts 4:18 (NLT) So they called the apostles back in and commanded them never again to speak or teach in the name of Jesus.

Acts 4:19-20 (NLT) But Peter and John replied, “Do you think God wants us to obey you rather than him? We cannot stop telling about everything we have seen and heard.”

AWE: An overwhelming feeling of reverence, admiration and fear

What has our AWE can command our heart.

Misdirected AWE keeps us dissatisfied.

Genesis 3:5 (NLT) “God knows that your eyes will be opened as soon as you eat it, and you will be like God, knowing both good and evil.”

The great battle is not the battle of behavior; it’s the battle for what kind of awe will rule your heart.

Psalms 46:10 (NIV) He says, “Be still, and know that I am God; I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth.”

Being still is the first step in restoring our awe.

Psalms 145:5-7 (NLT) I will meditate on your majestic, glorious splendor and your wonderful miracles.

Focusing on God’s greatness is the most crucial part about being still.

Psalms 46:10 (NIV) He says, “Be still, and know that I am God...”

Psalms 145:1-3 (NLT) I will exalt You, my God and King, and praise Your name forever and ever. I will praise You every day; yes, I will praise You forever. Great is the Lord! He is most worthy of praise! No one can measure His greatness.

Grace needs awe.

Philippians 2:12 (NLT) Therefore, my dear friends, as you have always obeyed—not only in my presence, but now much more in my absence—continue to work out your salvation with fear and trembling.

To win the war for your heart, win the war for your awe.
